### **97/22 TO APPROVE THE PARKS AND PLAYPARK STRATEGY**

The City Director explained the proposed strategy for updating the City's playparks and detailed in the pre-circulated report.

The Council were informed of an additional £5,000, which had been left in trust for the Coed Mawr play area. This amount could be added to the Council's budget if it was matched by the City Council.

### **98/22 TO DISCUSS AN ASSET TRANSFER OF BEACH ROAD PLAYING FIELD**

The Council were appraised of a Cyngor Gwynedd offer to lease Beach Road playing field to the City Council, for a period of 99 years, at a nominal fee of £1 p.a. The current cost of maintaining the field is around £2,000 p.a. but this figure could be reduced by more proactive management.

**IT WAS RESOLVED** to agree to the transfer in principal, and authorise the City Director to continue negotiations.
